## Dear Fellow Gardeners,

Thanks for having the interest to read our 2010 listing of Edible and Ornamental Bulbs.

This year we list 5 different GARLIC varieties as well as our traditional range of well priced, high quality ornamental bulbs.

**Quarantine Note:** Giant Russian and Oriental Purple Garlic cannot be sent to Tasmania.

All these edible bulbs are untreated and guaranteed to grow. This group of plants prefers full sun where possible, plus a fertile open soil.

**GARLIC**, (*Allium sativum*) Available January to June.

**4690 - Giant Russian or Elephant.** (*Allium ampeloprasum porrum*). Huge mild cloves. It is both edible and ornamental. Not to Tas. *Minimum 3 cloves.*

3 to 5 cloves - \$1.80 each  
5 to 10 cloves - \$1.70 each.

**4691 - Italian. (Common).** Traditional strongly pungent variety. Divided Cloves ready for planting.  
*Minimum 10 cloves.*

10 cloves: 32 cents each. (continued)

51 to 100 cloves: 26 cents each.

**4691B - Italian. (Common).** Undivided bulbs. (Approx 200 to 300 cloves per Kg.)  
*Minimum undivided is 500 grams.*

## ALLIUMS

Relatives of the edible Onion, these bulbs all have lovely flower heads. Full sun is their preferred situation.

**9508 - Purple Drumsticks.** (*A. sphaerocephalon*). Violet-purple cone shaped flowers on 90 cm. stems. Flowers 5 cm. across in late spring-early summer.  
*Minimum 5 bulbs.*  
5 to 10 bulbs: 64 cents each.  
11 or more: 52 cents each.

**9498 - Schubertii.** (*A. schubertii*). Huge round heads (to 35 cm across) of rosy purple flowers on stems 30 to 60 cm tall. Each: \$16.00.

**ALSTROMERIA** (Peruvian Lily) (*A. x hybrids*).

*Orders containing Alstromeria tubers will be held back until late February.*

Alstromerias are excellent for full sun and semi shade and even for warmer Districts. They make superb long lasting cut flowers on stems to 1 metre. Expect flowers through spring and well into summer. Supplied as tubers.

**9154 - Mona Lisa.** Pale pink on the outside with the inside being ivory with a pink blush. Superb.

**9151 - Regina.** Rosy pink with gold. Our favourite variety.

Continued water shortages in many areas means a degree of caution for many gardeners. It is comforting to realise that most of the bulbs in our list require little if any additional water during growth.

## EDIBLE BULB SEED

**1722 - Straightleaf** (*A. fistulosum*). Best cultivar for Spring onions or Scallions, this non bulbing cultivar can be sown all year. Best used when 0.5 to 1 cm across. Sow sparingly and do not thin out. Vigorous upright growth.  
Pkt: 500 seeds: \$3.50 25g: \$10.60.

**2080 - Chives Large Leaf** (*Allium schoenoprasum*). C. As above but with thicker and taller leaves for greater yields. Treated seed to Tasmania. Pkt: 200 seeds: \$3.50 10g: \$16.20. 950 s/g.

**2034 - Chives Garlic / Chinese Chives** (*Allium tuberosum*). C M. Perennial. Flat leaves to 30 cm with a mild garlic flavour. Use for all salads and cooking. Attractive white flowers. Best sown in spring. Treated seed to Tasmania. Packets only: 120 seeds: \$3.50.

**9501 - De Caen Mix** (Cottage Anemones) Appealing single flowers in a range of brilliant mixed colours. Very appealing and ideal massed.

## ARUM

Hardy and evergreen. Attractive leaves. Flowers in spring. .

## DAFFODILS

(*Narcissus hybrids*)

Daffodils are always appreciated as they remind us of the coming of spring. They are one of the hardiest and attractive of all bulbs, particularly in cold districts. All are excellent in containers, and most naturalise well. Daffodils prefer cooler districts, seldom performing well in hot areas. Most varieties flower late winter and early spring.

Requires part shade.

## HYACINTH

(*Hyacinthus orientalis*) Best known of the perfumed bulbs. Excellent in pots or for "formal" gardens. Not satisfactory outdoors in hotter areas. Flowers appear in August-September.

## IRIS

### DUTCH IRIS

(*Iris xiphium x tingitana*).

## TULIPS

(*Tulipa hybrids*). Regarded as one of the most beautiful and spectacular of bulbs, Tulips thrive in well-drained soils; they are easily grown in the garden or container and make a superb cut flower. They are the highlight of the garden during their flowering in September and October.

New introductions have been selected from hundreds of varieties to ensure their suitability to Australian conditions and are worth serious consideration.

*Tulips can be encouraged to flower evenly by placing the bulbs in the crisper of the refrigerator for 6 to 8 weeks before planting out in April or May, but make sure they are not kept there while fruit is being stored. This is required in any area that does not have cold winters and cold soil to obtain good length flower stems. In warm areas, keep the soil well mulched. Lift the bulbs when the leaves begin to die back, cleaning and storing them in a dry mild position at 16 to 23 deg. C. between December and February to ensure good flower development in the following year. Refrigerate as above before replanting into well-prepared soil.*
