ARTICHOKES - Jerusalem

(*Helianthus tuberosus*). Available June to Early August. Plants to 2 metres with small yellow flowers. Tubers are eaten steamed, boiled or as a soup. Space tubers 30 cm apart. Excellent in Diabetic diets. Supplied as tubers.

4640 - Elongated The plants produce masses of elongated cream tubers

4641 - Rounded Rounded cream tubers, somewhat knobby. Tall attractive plants.

Prices for EACH of the above Cultivars, per

CULTIVAR: Minimum 10 tubers

Each: 80 cents each. 11 or more: 70 cents each.

ARTICHOKES - Globe

(*Cynara scolymus*). Large grey leafed thistle-like plants with tasty flower buds. Buds are harvested while tight, the fleshy base of the leaves and heart is eaten. Harvest while still tight. Transplant in winter up to 1 metre apart. Cut down annually after flowering. Perennial. Likes heavy feeding.

4638 - Green Globe Large succulent flower buds are borne on attractive grey-green 1 metre tall plants. 1 to 3 plants: \$6.60 each, 4 to 10 plants: \$6.10 each: 11 or more: \$5.60 each.

4639 - Purple Headed. This variety has purple heads that are less plump than the green variety. Often considered the best to eat. rather than green heads. Often preferred. 1 to 3 plants: \$6.60 each, 4 to 10 plants: \$6.10 each: 11 or more: \$5.60 each.

ASPARAGUS

(*Asparagus officinalis*). Available winter only. Space 30 - 45 cm apart. Well grown beds can last for 30 to 50 years. Large one year old bare rooted crowns, freshly dug to ensure success. Definitely a long term proposition. Best in a deep friable soil. Supplied as bare rooted crowns. Supplies Limited again this year.

4651 - Mary Washington 500 An older, but reliable cultivar that resists Asparagus Rust. 5 to 10 crowns: \$2.20 each 11 to 25: \$2.00 each 26 or more: \$1.80 each.

4652 - UC 157 Hybrid Vigorous hybrid from which spears can be cut a year earlier than older cultivars. Produces greater size and quantity than Mary Washington. 5 to 10 crowns: \$3.30 each 11 to 25: \$3.20 each 26 or more: \$3.10 each.

4650 - Sweet Purple Vigorous plants with purple spears. Reputed to be sweeter and more tender than other types. 5 to 10 crowns: \$3.30 each, 11 to 25: \$3.20 each, 26 or more: \$3.10 each.

BLUEBERRIES

NOT TO TASMANIA

Supplied in 14 cm pots. Available June to August

High Bush Varieties. (*Vaccinium corymbosum*).

These are not suited to hot areas. Blueberries generally thrive where Rhododendrons grow well. Space plants 1 metre apart.

4655 - Blue Rose High yielding with medium sized fruit in late December and January.

4656 - Margaret Earliest fruiting variety from early December. Good size fruit.

4643 - Northland Heavy crops of medium sized fruit from mid December. Excellent home garden variety.

BRAMBLES

Available June to August only. Brambles are pruned in winter by cutting out the old canes that fruited the previous season and tying up the new canes to a trellis. Plant several types to extend the cropping season. A cold winter is required for flower formation. Cropping periods are for Southern Victoria. Space plants 1.5 to 2 metres apart. Supplied as bare rooted canes.

THORNY BRAMBLES:

4661 - Boysenberry (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*).

Plump purple berries borne on strong growing plants. Excellent flavour. Crops late December into January. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4665 - Lawtonberry (*Rubus allegheniensis x hybrids*).

Blackberry like fruit on stiff strongly growing canes. Heavy crops from late December to early February. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4662 - Loganberry (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*). The distinct sharp taste gives this berry the reputation of being the best of all for taste. Fruits through December. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4660 - Silvanberry (American Blackberry) (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*). This vigorous bramble has heavy crops of large Blackberry like fruit. Excellent fresh or cooked. Crops December. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4658 - Tayberry (*Rubus hybrid*). A Loganberry x Black Raspberry cross from Scotland. Heavy yields of Loganberry like fruit, but sweeter and less acid. Eat fresh or as jam.

1 to 3 plants: \$7.70 each 4 or more: \$7.30 each.

4659 - Youngberry (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*). Tasty dark purple fruit similar to Boysenberry, but matures around 2 weeks earlier.

1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

THORNLESS BRAMBLES

Excellent crops without the hassle of prickles!

4667 - Blackberry "Thornfree" (*Rubus x ulmifolius*). Vigorous, thornless and very heavy cropper. Fruit is large, black and delicious when fully ripe. Crops February and March. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4666 - Blackberry "Chester" Thornless (*Rubus x ulmifolius*). Similar to the above, but with larger clusters of fruit that are less tart before full maturity. Crops February and March. 1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

4663 - Thornless Loganberry (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*). All the distinctive taste of normal Logans without the thorns. 1 to 3 plants: \$8.60 each 4 or more: \$8.30 each.

4664 - Thornless Youngberry. (*Rubus ursinus x hybrids*) As for "Thorny" Youngberry but without the prickles. December cropping.

1 to 3 plants: \$4.70 each 4 to 10 plants: \$4.50 each 11 or more: \$4.30 each.

CURRANTS

NOT TO TASMANIA

Available June to August only. Currants need a cold winter and will not fruit in hot districts. Allow 1 to 1.5 metres between plants. Great for jams, pies etc. Supplied as bare rooted plants.

BLACK CURRANTS (*Ribes nigrum*). Rich source of Vitamin C. Bears fruit on the previous seasons wood. Prune by cutting out old wood and spent branches to encourage new growth.

4680 - Unnamed Produces good quality fruit. Each: \$7.20 2 to 5 plants: \$6.90 each 6 or more: \$6.60 each.

4687 - Goliath A large fruited cultivar. Fruits in late December. Each: \$8.30 2 to 5 plants: \$7.95 each 6 or more: \$7.60 each.

4685 - Super Champion. Another large fruited variety. Reliable. Each: \$8.30 2 to 5 plants: \$7.95 each 6 or more: \$7.60 each.

RED CURRANTS (*Ribes sativum*). Great for jams and jellies. Plants are vigorous. Fruit is borne on spurs. To prune, shorten the leaders and reduce length of side shoots to encourage development of fruit spurs.

4681 - Unnamed Good quality red fruit, but unnamed. Each: \$7.20 2 to 5 plants: \$6.90 each 6 or more: \$6.60 each.

ELDERBERRY

Available June to August. Bare rooted.

4645 - Elderberry (*Sambucus niger*). Small ornamental tree to 5 metres, producing masses of white flowers followed by dark berries ripening in mid Autumn. Fruit used for making wine etc. Each: \$12.60.

GOOSEBERRIES (ENGLISH)

NOT TO TASMANIA

(*Ribes uva-crispa* syn *R. grossularia*). Available June to August. Gooseberries need a cold winter and will not fruit in warm districts. Space 1 metre apart. Fruits November and December. Used in jams, jellies, pies etc. or eaten fresh. Bare rooted plants.

4703 - Captivator Thornless No Thorns! Small red fruit. Plants resist American Mildew which have decimated other varieties. Each: \$7.20 2 to 5 plants: \$6.90 each 6 or more: \$6.60 each.

GOOSEBERRIES (CHINESE) (Kiwi Fruit)

(*Actinidia deliciosa* syn. *A. chinensis*). Available June to August. Needs shelter from hot winds. As male and female flowers are borne on separate plants, one of each must be grown together. On larger plantings, one male is grown with up to 8 females. Allow 6 to 7 metres between plants. Needs to grow on a trellis. Supplied as 2 Year old bare rooted plants.

4674 - Kiwi Fruit Pair. One plant each of Heyward and Male pollinator. Pair \$45.00.

4670 - Heyward Reliable and moderately vigorous cultivar with heavy crops of large oval fruit.

4671 - Bruno Heavy crops of elongated fruit on vigorous plants

4675 - Pollinator Male One male plant must be provided for each 8 females.

Prices for EACH of the above Chinese Gooseberry Cultivars, per CULTIVAR: Each: \$25.50.

HORSERADISH

Available June to September. Allow 30 cm between plants. Supplied as root cuttings.

4710 - Horseradish (*Amaracea rusticana*). Used to make Horseradish sauce or pickles. Perennial, but best treated as an annual. Dig in winter. Recipes are included. 1 to 4 cuttings: \$2.00 each 5 or more \$1.00 each

JOSTABERRY

(*Ribes nidigrolaria*)
NOT TO TASMANIA

Cross between Black Currant and Gooseberry. Available June to end August. Require a cold winter and will not fruit in warm districts. Bare rooted plants.

4678 - Jostaberry Fruit large like the Gooseberry, with the colour of the Black Currant. Excellent tart taste. Use fresh or in preserves. Plants to 2 m tall. Each: \$10.40.

POTATOES

(*Solanum tuberosum*) Available May to October NOT TO QUEENSLAND, TASMANIA or WESTERN AUSTRALIA. All our Potatoes are Certified Seed tubers, sourced from registered and accredited growers. All seed crops are inspected during growth to ensure varietal purity, trueness to type and freedom from disease. The use of Certified Seed Potatoes gives greater yields and increased vigour. They are packed by New Gippsland Seeds & Bulbs under Licence from the Victorian Certified Seed Potato Authority. To calculate the quantity of Potatoes required, allow around 8 to 12 tubers per kilogram at a spacing of 25 to 30 cm apart.

4871 - Coliban Round tubers with white skin and flesh. Best for baking and roasting. \$5.80 per kilo or \$5.40 for 2 or more kilos.

4872 - Desiree Tubers are a long oval shape with pink skin and pale yellow flesh Best for boiling, salads and roasting. \$5.80 per kilo or \$5.40 for 2 or more kilos.

4873 - Nicola The long oval tubers have yellow skin and deep yellow flesh. An excellent all-round variety except for fries. This variety may require a longer cooking time than most. \$5.80 per kilo or \$5.40 for 2 or more kilos.

4874 - Pontiac Rounded tubers with pale red skin and white flesh. A good all-round variety, but not for fries. \$5.80 per kilo or \$5.40 for 2 or more kilos.

4875 - Sebago Tubers are oval with white skin and flesh. A very good all round variety. \$5.80 per kilo or \$5.40 for 2 or more kilos.

4876 - Potato Collection 4 tubers each of our 5 varieties (total 20 tubers), each separately packaged and labelled. Each collection \$12.80.

RASPBERRIES

(*Rubus idaeus x hybrids*)

Available June to August. Allow 30 cm per plant. Bare rooted canes. We recommend planting in raised beds to avoid any chance of waterlogging. *Minimum 5 plants per cultivar.*

4758 - Heritage Crops continually from late summer to late autumn on new growth. Pruned by removing all growth over winter. 5 to 10 plants: \$2.40 each 11 to 25: \$2.20 each 26 or more: \$2.00 each.

4755 - Williamette High quality summer cropping cultivar with another crop in autumn. High yields of good tasting firm berries. Limited supplies this year. 5 to 10 plants: \$2.40 each 11 to 25: \$2.20 each 26 or more: \$2.00 each.

PERENNIALS & ORNAMENTALS

AGAPANTHUS

(*Agapanthus praecox orientalis*). Available June to August. Hardy evergreen which is very suited to backgrounds or as edging in difficult situations. Flowers in summer on long stems. Smaller types ideal in containers. Supplied as bare rooted plants.

4890 - Large White Goes well when interplanted with the large blue. Stems to 1 metre plus.

4891 - Large Blue The most widely grown and hardiest type. Flowers pale blue and long lasting. Stems to 1 metre plus..

4892 - Peter Pan (Baby Blue). A short fine-leaved cultivar with impressive pale blue flowers. Its small size (50 cm), makes it suited to rockeries, borders etc.

4894 - Snowman (Baby White). As above but with pure white flowers on stems to 60 cm. Prices for each of the above 2 cultivars, per cultivar. 1 to 5 plants: \$3.50 each 6 to 10 plants: \$ 3.20 each 11 or more: \$2.90 each.

ARTHROPODIUM

Available June to August.

4720 - Rengarenga Lily (*A. cirrhatum*). Perennial with sprays of nodding cupped white flowers in early summer. Flower stems to 1 metre. Loves sheltered sites and some shade. Each: \$6.60, 2 or more: \$6.00 each.

DAHLIA - TREE

(*Dahlia imperialis*)

4721 - Lavender Huge plants 3 to 5 metres tall bearing terminal clusters of single lavender pink flowers in autumn. We offer easily grown stem cuttings for planting direct into the garden. 1 to 4 cuttings: \$4.00 each 5 or more: \$3.50 each.

4759 - Nootka Summer cropping variety with high yield of medium size attractive fruit. Fruit resists rot. Produces a good autumn crop on the tips of new growth 5 to 10 plants: \$2.40 each 11 to 25: \$2.20 each 26 or more: \$2.00 each.

4757 - Smoothy Exclusive! **Thornless** Everbearing type with absolutely no prickles and excellent flavoured fruit of good size. Crops on the new growth, fruiting from late summer onwards. Prune each winter by removing all canes. Grows to around 1.2 metres. 5 to 10 plants: \$2.95 each 11 or more: \$2.65 each.

RHUBARB

(*Rheum rhabarbarum*)

Available June to August only.

These Crowns are from divided plants, not from variable seedlings.

4762 - Ever Red Dark red stems that grows throughout the year, even in colder periods. Each: \$8.00, 3 or more \$7.60 each.

4761 - Wandin Giant Huge stems, good colour and tasty. Well grown stems will be 90cm long and as thick as a mans wrist. LIMITED SUPPLIES. Each \$22.00.

STRAWBERRIES

(*Fragaria x Ananassa*)

CERTIFIED VIRUS FREE PLANTS. Available end of May to August only as bare rooted plants. Allow 30 - 37 cm between plants. Replace bed after 3 years.

4780 - Red Gauntlet An excellent reliable cultivar that will crop through the whole season. Berries are a rich red colour.

4781 - Tioga Very firm dark red fruit of excellent quality, appearance and flavour. Very good in cooler districts, with best crops in the second year.

4782 - Torrey Good flavoured and reliable cultivar for hotter areas. Excellent leaf cover. Firm fruit and heavy crops.

Prices for EACH of the above Strawberry Cultivars, per CULTIVAR *Minimum 10 of each cultivar.* 10 plants: 94 cents each 11 - 25 plants: 88 cents each, 26 - 50 plants: 84 cents each 51 or more: 80 cents each.

4779 - Lowanna Continuous cropping cultivar that grows well in all districts. Crops continuously from October to late May in Southern areas. Fruit conical, large and attractive. *Minimum of 10 plants.* 10 plants: \$1.10 each 11 - 25 plants: \$1.05 each 26 or more: 99 cents each.

YAMS - NEW ZEALAND (OCA)

(*Oxalis tuberosa*). A favourite of New Zealanders. Originally from the High Andes, it was a staple food to South American natives. Still widely cultivated in those areas. Non invasive. **Very limited supplies this year.** Available June to August.

4789 - Purple Small purple tubers that are delicious when baked. *Maximum 10 tubers.* Each tuber 80 cents.

DAYLILIES (*Hemerocallis spp.*)

We believe you will be impressed with this range of high quality plants. They have been selected as the best available at affordable prices. Very hardy, easily grown and drought resistant perennial. Flower from Summer to early Autumn. Drought Tolerant. Available June to November.

Miniatures - Flowers up to 7.5 cm (3 ") Ideal in containers.

4960 - Lady Mischief Rose pink with a dark rose eye. Stems to 45 cm. Evergreen.

4963 - Regency Summer Vigorous plants with yellow gold flowers on 60 cm stems. Petal edges frilled with gold. Semi evergreen.

Medium - Flowers to 10 cm (4")

4966 - Bafo Striking light yellow with maroon eye. Stems to 45 cm. Evergreen.

4967 - Cenla Pecan Fragrant! Cream with a burgundy eye zone. Stems to 45 cm. Semi evergreen.

4968 - Idle Chatter Pink with a red eye. Stems to 55 cm. Evergreen.

4970 - Seeing Red Dazzling cardinal red with a chartreuse throat. Plants evergreen.

Large - Flowers to 15 cm (6") across.

4979 - Angels Image Flowers are a soft apricot with a rose eye and gold throat. Edged lightly ruffled with yellow. Stems to 75 cm.

4975 - Beerwah Beauty Large ruffled pale peach pink flowers with a rose eye and green throat. Excellent re bloomer. Stems to 75 cm. Evergreen.

4978 - Florentine Princess Rosy mauve with a paler eye. Stems to 65 cm. Evergreen.

4980 - Sparkling Dawn Creamy yellow ruffled flowers with a light purple eye zone. Stems to 62 cm. Evergreen.

Doubles

4985 - Desdemona Blend of magenta and rose. Flowers 10 cm. across on stems to 50 cm. Semi evergreen.

4987 - Double Pink Paeony Cup shaped 10 cm flowers in rose pink with a cream underside. Stems to 55 cm. Semi evergreen.

4988 - Mount Helena Golden yellow with a rich burgundy centre. Flowers 12.5 cm on 50 cm stems.

DIERAMA (Fairy Fishing Rods)

Grass like plant with long graceful arching spikes of eye catching pink flowers. Available August & September.

4820 - Fairy Fishing Rods (*Dierama pendulum*).

Hardy, tolerating varied conditions, but best grown in a sunny position. Each: \$6.00.

GINGER LILY (*Hedychium Gardnerianum*).

Supplied as rhizomes

4290 - Yellow Highly scented cream flowers with bright red stamens. Plants to 1.3m tall. Expect flowers in late summer. Grows well in sun or semi shade. One to 3 plants \$4.30 each, 4 or more: \$4.00 each.

GLADIOLUS

(*Gladiolus x hortulanus*). Available June to September. All corms are size 1, i.e. with a circumference of 12 cm and over.

HELLEBORUS

Available June to August.

4845 - Lenten Rose (*H. orientalis*). Flowers to 8 cm across opening green and fading to purple/brown. Loves semi shade. Very hardy.

KNIFOPHIA (Red Hot Pokers)

Available Winter only. Bare rooted plants.

4863 - Winter Cheer Tall brilliant red/orange flower spikes to 1.5 m. in winter. 1 to 5 plants: \$5.00 each 6 or more: \$4.80 each.

4864 - Gold Else Yellow flowers on 80 cm stems. Summer flowering. \$4.50 each.

LILY OF THE VALLEY

Available June to August.

4840 - White (*Convallaria majalis*). Superbly scented heads made up of many miniature white bells. *Minimum of 5 rhizomes*. 5 to 10 rhizomes: \$1.05 each 11 or more: 93 cents each.

LUPINS

(*Lupinus x hybrida*) Not to Tasmania.

Available June to August. Requires well drained soil and cold winters. Divided crowns from mature plants. Regret unable to guarantee specific colours.

4630 - Russell Tall Mixed . Spikes to 60 cm in an excellent range of colours including bicolours. 1 to 5 plants: \$5.50 each 6 or more: \$5.00 each.

ORCHID

4746 - Chinese Ground Orchid (*Bletilla striata*).

Deciduous terrestrial Orchid for cool conditions. Produces 50cm spikes of pale pink flowers in late spring. Likes summer shade and dislikes hot areas. Thrives in the garden. Each \$4.60.

Available June to end August.

Available June to October.

4775 - Jacobean Lily (*S. formosissima*). Scarlet orchid like blooms on 35 cm stems. Excellent as a cut flower, it mainly blooms in December and January. Tolerates some shade.

TUBEROSE

Available June to October. Bulbs.

4848 - Double Pearl (*Polianthes tuberosa*).

Exquisitely perfumed double white flowers on 75 cm stems from December to February. Excellent long lasting cut flower. Suits warm climates and well-drained soil. 1 to 5 bulbs: \$2.50 each, 6 to 10: \$2.30 each, 11 or more: \$2.00 each.

WATERLILIES

(*Nymphaea spp.*). Available June to end August. Bare rooted plants.
